

Spyridium globulosum
Commonly: Basket Bush
Vascular Plant Family: Rhamnaceae

Flowers winter and spring

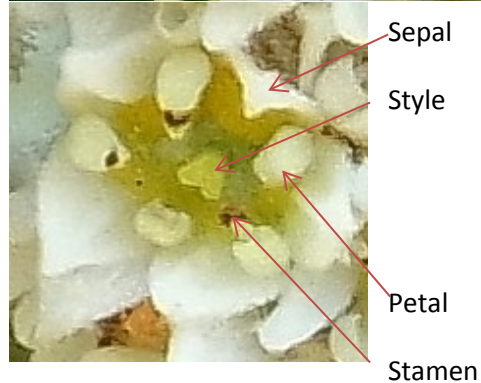
Spyridium globulosum is a shrub which can reach 3m in height in sheltered positions. The branches have star-shaped hairs on the surface.



The flowers are 1mm long, a dirty white or cream. There are 5 triangular, hairy sepals, 5 hood-shaped petals each hiding an anther and 5 stamens in a ring-like disc, The ovary is below the flowers.



The young stems are red with distinct ribs. The leaves are shortly stalked up to 60mm long and 30mm wide with stipules at the base of the stalk. The stipules are up to 4mm long, thick and densely hairy.



The inflorescence is very densely flowered.



The fruit is a 3-celled capsule separating into 3 fruitlets.
