

Eremophila glabra* subsp. *albicans

Commonly: Tar Bush

Vascular Plant Family: Scrophulariaceae

Flowers late winter to early spring

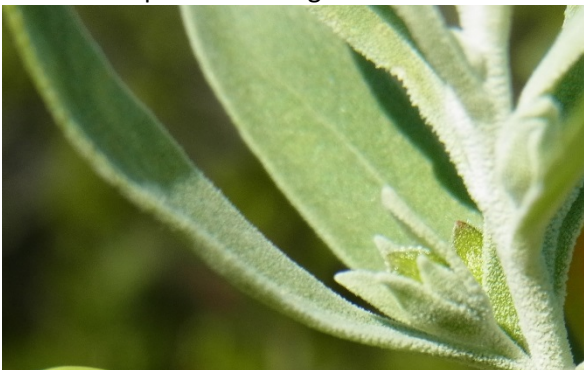
Eremophila glabra subsp. *albicans* is a low spreading to erect shrub about 100cm tall. The leaves are scattered or clustered, with sparse to dense star-shaped hairs.



The flowers are tubular with the upper 4 lobes joined close together and the 5th lobe separated lower down. The 5 sepals are densely white hairy. The 4 stamens and the style are exerted well beyond the flower



The branches and leaves have scattered to dense white star-shaped hairs on the surface. The leaves are up to 25cm long and 6mm wide.



There is a solitary, shortly stalked flower in the axil of a leaf. The flowers vary in colour from orange to yellow.
