Melaleuca nesophylla

Commonly: Western Honey Myrtle

Vascular Plant Family: Myrtaceae

Flowers in summer and autumn

Melaleuca nesophylla is a large shrub or tree up to 4m tall. This species is native to the south coast of Western Australia but some plants have become established near the Wave Walk Car Park. It is a species commonly planted in gardens.



The bark on the trunk and branches is papery.



The leaves are alternate, ovate and spreading.



The flowers are in terminal often on short branches. The flowers are pink, the colour coming from the bundles of stamens. The petals and sepals are relatively insignificant.



The fruits form globular masses.
